INSURANCE

Third-party insurance, as a minimum, is mandatory to enter the event. If you're bringing your own boat or chartering, please confirm with your provider that it covers sailing and third-party insurance in the UK.

RIBS & ON THE WATER SAILOR SUPPORT

The UK operates slightly differently to many other countries in that the Race Management and Support fleet are managed and organised by IOCA (UK).

All Official Support Vessels/RIBs will have a responsibility to assist all sailors (including those sailors travelling without coach support) and can be assured they will be supported on the water by the fleet.

IOCA will also have coaches on the water to support the main fleet. The role of the IOCA Main Fleet Coach is to provide open event support to members at the class regattas. The coach(es) will run informal briefings in the morning covering information such as weather, rig setup and updated information from the Race Officer or class. The coaches will also be on hand around the boat park to offer tips on rigging.

On the water the coach(es) will be on safety boats and can be identified with a coach flag. Sailors can approach the coaches to ask for any on water support with rig, lunch storage, rules or a general chat about their race.

Post racing the coach(es) will provide an informal de-brief. This may be in smaller groups or individually. A time and destination will be announced to let sailors know where the coach is going to be.

There is no fee for the support of the coach(es) the costs will be covered by IOCA.
